

# German Language and Literature

## 1. General Overview

The Department of German Language and Literature was founded in 1981. The faculty, which includes a native speaker of German, is teaching German, German Linguistics, German Literature, German Studies, and Translation Studies with structured curricula. In addition to these regular curricula, the Department provides for an exchange-student program to Germany, short-term visit-Germany project, Korea-Germany seminar, mentoring by graduates, job talk for German companies, and other group studies. Alumni-funded scholarships are awarded to students every semester in addition to regular University scholarships. For intensive learning of German, the Department provides special classes for ZD (German Certificate) exam, individual or group conversation sessions with a native speaker, and reading sessions of Western literary classics, all free of charge.

## 2. Educational Goals/Objectives

The Department aims to train students to be professional experts who can effectively function in Korea-Germany interface, intellectually, culturally, and commercially. We provide academic subjects in the German language, German linguistics, German literature, German studies, and translation studies. We also take care of students' need to take ZD exam by providing intensive instruction.
